## 2017 Teachers & Adjudicators Register

Dear Colleague,

The Teachers & Adjudicators register on the TDCI website is an ideal way in which to publicize your qualifications and/or your dance school.

The charge for this, which is set for 2017 is £25. This fee includes your name and contact details, and must state your qualifications. It can also include your dance school, and remains on the TDCI website for a period of 12 months. Note; Adjudicators must comply with the TDCI ruling for festivals and Championships.

For TDCI Championships , adjudicators must hold at least one Fellowship qualification in Ballet, Tap or Modern, and a Licentiate qualification in the other two genres. By adding your details to the website, organisers can see clearly who they are able to engage as a Championship Adjudicator.

Please complete the attached slip below and return with your cheque to the value of £25 made payable to the "Theatre Dance Council International".

I wish to draw your attention also to the Competitors Registration Scheme. This is the responsibility of the teacher to ensure their Championship Competitors are registered with the TDCI. All cards operate January to December each year. Please apply early in the year for registration cards, and at least 6 weeks before the first required Championship. Forms are available on the second page of the TDCI website by clicking the yellow box at the top of the page, and following the link.
